Draft Minutes

1	Welcome Marek Szyndel welcomed all representatives of the ICA member institutions and other delegates to the ICA General Assembly 2019. The draft Agenda was approved.		
2	Presentations:		
	Presentation of UniLaSalle by Philippe Choquet, President of UniLaSalle and the host of the ICA General Assembly and ICA Rectors and Deans Forum 2019. Marek Szyndel thanked Philippe Choquet for inviting ICA to UniLaSalle.		
3	Minutes of the General Assembly held on Wednesday 24 October 2018		
	The minutes were approved by all members present, and then signed as proof by Marek S Szyndel, President of ICA and Simon Heath, ICA Secretary General.		
4	Report of the President on behalf of the ICA Board		
	Marek Szyndel presented his report on behalf of the ICA Board. He looked back to the Celebrations of the 30 th Anniversary of ICA at the time of the ICA Rectors and Deans		

Forum held at Wageningen University and Research on the 25 and 26 October 2018. At the Anniversary dinner Dr Christian Patermann listed several question facing society and challenged ICA to take a lead in addressing these questions.

Marek Szyndel outlined the Rectors and Deans Forum 2019 focusing on *Collaboration* between European & African Life Science Universities for a Sustainable Future during the following two days. The expected outcome were:

- Identified mutual benefits that can be gained from the collaboration between European and African life science universities.
- A renewed focus to on-going activities and new opportunities to address the global challenges
- Initiation of new relationships between African and European like-minded agricultural and life science universities.

He thanked Carolyn Glynn (President of AGRINATURA & SLU) and Philippe Petithuguenin (Deputy Director for Research and Strategy, CIRAD, Montpellier) for their collaboration with ICA in developing the programme for the 2019 Forum.

Marek Szyndel also outlined the plans for the ICA Rectors and Deans Forum 2020 with our sister associations in North America, Association of Public and Land Grant Universities (APLU) in the US and the Canadian Faculties of Agriculture and Life Sciences (ACFAVM). The developing theme of the Forum was planned as *Agriculture and Life Science Megatrends: Addressing Gaping Holes*.

Marek Szyndel referred to the work of the ICA Board Committees, ICA-Bio and ICA-Edu, and to the contribution of the ICA Standing Committees to the aims of ICA to enhance the contribution of agricultural and Life Science Universities. The reports of the Board Committees and Standing Committees were delivered in the following Agenda Items.

Marek Syndel addressed the upcoming elections to the Board, see MInute 12. Marek Szyndel thanked Peter Bielik, who was stepping down from the Board, for his contribution to the work of the Board during the past three years.

5 Report of ICA-Bioeconomy Committee of the ICA Board (ICA-Bio)

Josef Glössl presented his report of ICA-Bio.

Josef Glössl participated at the BIOEAST Conference "Bioeconomy in the forefront of national policies" on 8 Nov. 2018 in Budapest. It was agreed to follow-up co-operation between BIOEAST and ICA-Bio on Education and Training for the Bioeconomy in order to strengthen the European perspective.

Josef Glössl attended the Preparatory Workshop for the Global Bioeconomy Summit 2020 (GBS) as a member of the International Advisory Council (IAC) for the GBS 2020; on the 11 and 12 March 2019 in Beijing. ICA-Bio together with UNESCO proposed a Workshop on "International Cooperation in Education and Training for the Bioeconomy" to be held at GBS 2020

Josef Glössl and Simon Heath attended the UNESCO Stakeholder Steering Committee Meeting "Bolstering Biotechnology Research and Education: Building Human and Institutional Capacities for the Bioeconomy" held on 26 September 2019 at the UNESCO Headquarters, Paris

Josef Glössl participated in the Workshop "Promoting education, training and skills across the bioeconomy" held on 15 October 2019, Brussels; by invitation by EC DG Research & Innovation

Josef Glössl, Michal Lostak and Simon Heath attended a meeting in Prague on 19 September 2019 organised by the BioCan Do project to discuss the initiation of a

Community of Practice for Biobased Education. A follow-up meeting of 8 persons was held on 15 October 2019 in Brussels at which it was agreed the **Community of Practice for Bioeconomy** should be formed and a number of activities were proposed.

ICA is a partner in the EU COST-Proposal "Education on the Bioeconomy" submitted by April 2018, re-submitted in Nov. 2018 and Sept. 2019

Report from ICA-Edu Committee of the ICA Board: Network for Innovation in Life Sciences Higher Education (ICA-Edu)

Paper 1 Summary of the ICA-Edu Colloquium 2019

Barbara Hinterstoisser presented her report of ICA-Edu.

The ICA-Edu Colloquium 2019 with the title Let the entrepreneurial genie out of the bottle! how will we stimulate the nascent entrepreneurial skills of our students? was held Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 May 2019 at the Leuven Institute for Ireland in Europe, Leuven, Belgium. The Workshop was organised by Thomas Lans, Education and Learning Sciences, Wageningen University, NL. The Workshop was attended by 35 delegates and the outcome of the Workshop is outlined in Paper 1.

A follow up Colloquium in 2020 is planned **Action to keep the entrepreneurial genie out** of the bottle! Engaging students with sustainable entrepreneurial education in your curriculum. This will be held in May 2020 at the University of Copenhagen.

The INTRINSIC Project continues focusing on Innovative Education for Sustainable Entrepreneurship Education in Life Sciences https://www.intrinsic.eu/index.html. The project organises regular Webinars focusing on embedding entrepreneurial education in the curriculum

Yvan Larondelle, ICA Treasurer, reported on the Accounts for 2018 Paper 2 and the Auditors Report of the 2018 Accounts, Paper 4

The Balance Sheet for the financial year 2018 shows that the opening balance of 128.300 € on January 1 decreased to give the closing balance of 116.037 €. This decrease in the closing net capital for 2018 is the result of the deficit 12.263 € from the Income and Expenditure Account. This deficit arose from the need to repay 15.000€ after the EU audit of the ELFRUS project of 15.000€. This repayment was made because the coordinator of the project had not followed the rules of the contract with the Commission. If the outstanding membership subscriptions 8.125 € are deducted, the secure cash assets stand at 107.912 €. The assets are thus clearly above the agreed minimum level of reserves of 50 000 € as agreed at the ICA General Assembly 2018.

In 2018 ICA contributed to the activities of the ICA-BIO and ICA-Edu networks for about 3.000 € in each case. This did not significantly impact on the ICA balance. Further support to ICA-Edu and ICA-Bio committees of the board, as well as to specific activities, is expected in 2020 and specific provisions have been foreseen in the budget of 2020.

Yvan Larondelle presented the Budget for 2020.

The Accounts for 2018 and the budget for 2020 were approved by the General Assembly

Proposal to set up the ICA Task Force to develop the Engagement of ICA with the EU in Brussels

Arthur Moll proposed, on behalf of the ICA Board, the establishment of an ICA Task Force with the objective to conduct a feasibility study to strengthen ICA's presence and influence with the EU Commission, the EU Parliament and other organisations in Brussels for the benefit of ICA members This initiative had been stimulated by the suggestion of Christian Patermann at the ICA Forum 2018 that there was an opportunity for ICA, in representing agricultural and life science universities, to engage more proactively with the EU.

The aim of the feasibility study will be to develop a road map for establishing an enhanced ICA operating environment after 2021.

Arthur Moll proposed to the General Assembly that a sub-committee of the ICA Board be established to determine the Terms of Reference for the Task Force. He asked that the ICA General Assembly approve the appointment of a person to co-ordinated the work of the Task Force on the basis of 1 to 1.5 days per week plus travelling expenses during 2020 and 2021 at a maximum cost of €22k per year to be taken from the ICA Reserves.

The ICA General Assembly strongly approved this initiative and the proposed withdrawal of funds from the reserves.

9 Membership subscription rates 2020

No changed in the full membership subscription of 1250€ per annum was proposed.

11 Report of GCHERA

Philippe Choquet presented a report of GCHERA – Global Confederation of Higher Education Association for the Agricultural and Life Sciences. He reported on the WK Kellogg Foundation three year project on undergraduate education targeted at universities in Mexico and Haiti. He hoped that the project could be expanded across the global network of GCHERA.

12 ICA Board Elections

Hubert Hasenauer's personal statement had been circulated as Paper 5.

There had been no other nominations. The General Assembly approved the election of the above candidates to the ICA Board for a term of three years

The ICA Board proposed the renewal of the co-option for a second term of three years to the ICA Board of **Philippe Choquet**, President, UniLaSalle, Beauvais, as representing GCHERA on the ICA Board and representing ICA at the GCHERA General Assembly. This was agreed.

Julian Park informed about platform ONE HE https://onehe.org OneHE is a new organisation, created in 2018, to enable educators to improve their teaching. There is plenty of innovation and excellence in HE teaching but the challenge is how to scale it. As a result, the OneHE platform was set up to support educators everywhere to connect, collaborate and share their practice and help others.

Julian Park has set up a global Subject Centre for Biology and Bioscience education on OneHE. It's free to anyone, anywhere in the world and he invites members of ICA to participate.
